Mississippi Radio Group strives each year to aggressively recruit for all open positions. Each opening is distributed to several locations including job fairs, colleges and universities in Northeast Mississippi. We also use national recruiting services, such as Indeed. Additionally, we promote the vacancy on-air on our stations and our social media.

INITIATIVE 1: On-air announcement of position vacancies. As a normal process, and an effort to reach all possible applicants, we utilize each of our stations to broadcast an open request for applications and encourage anyone with an interest or questions pertaining to the process or position, to contact us. Interviews are conducted without regard to race, religion, national origin, sex, age, disability, or genetic information.

INITIATIVE 2: On March 19, 2024, Mississippi State University in Starkville, MS hosted its Mississippi Association of Broadcasters Career Day in both McComas Hall and the University Library. The stations were represented by General Manager Raymond Jourdan. This event is designed to allow broadcast/journalism students to speak with industry professionals about a career in broadcasting. Items covered on panel one include one on one interviews with portfolio/reel review and networking, with a second panel discussion on the topic of careers in media.

INITIATIVE 3: On April 3, 2024, the University of Mississippi in Oxford, MS hosted its Mississippi Association of Broadcasters Career Day in Farley Hall. The stations were represented by General Manager Raymond Jourdan. This event is designed to allow broadcast/journalism students to speak with industry professionals about a career in broadcasting. There were two panel discussions. One panel session was for journalism students and MSPA high school attendees. The second was a critique session at Bishop Hall.
